### Principal's Message



Our students continue to enjoy being back at school however we are continuing with restrictions until the end of this term as announced by the Government last week. RAT Kits will be distributed to families each fortnight for the rest of the term. We are taking a very cautious approach and limiting events that require mixing large numbers of students. For example, there are no school assemblies this term. This also means that our 3-Way Parent Teacher Conferences, on 24 March, will be held online with teachers working from the school.

We have had to cancel the Year 6 Camp to Canberra. Schools are not able to take students interstate due to the chance of a teacher or student becoming ill with Covid whilst away. This would cause huge problems in transporting students and teachers and close contacts back to Melbourne or isolating them in Canberra without their family.

We are not running any assemblies or activities that would mean large groups of students, e.g. whole year levels, meet inside the Hall or within any school building.

We continue our safe and cautious approach in the interests of the whole school community.

#### Dropping and collecting children at school

Please do not park, or pull in, across any driveway to drop off or collect children at school. The City of Monash regularly patrol and fine drivers who do this.

The City of Monash traffic officers also regularly patrol and fine drivers who double park, park or stop and drop off children too close to pedestrian and supervised crossings or infringe traffic regulations in any way.

### FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE

#### INFORMATION FOR PARENTS

Every Victorian child should have access to the world of learning opportunities that exist beyond the classroom. The Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund helps ensure that no student will miss out on the opportunity to join their classmates for important, educational and fun activities. It is part of making Victoria the Education State and the Government's commitment to breaking the link between a student's background and their outcomes.

### CAMPS, SPORTS & EXCURSIONS FUND (CSEF)

School camps provide children with inspiring experiences in the great outdoors. Excursions encourage a deeper understanding of how the world works while sports teach teamwork, discipline and leadership. All are a part of a healthy curriculum.

CSEF is provided by the Victorian Government to assist eligible families to cover the costs of school trips, camps and sporting activities.

If you hold a valid means-tested concession card or are a temporary foster parent, you may be eligible for CSEF. A special consideration category also exists for asylum seeker and refugee families. The allowance is paid to the school to use towards expenses relating to camps, excursions or sporting activities for the benefit of your child.

The annual CSEF amount per student is:

- · \$125 for primary school students
- · \$225 for secondary school students

#### HOW TO APPLY

New applicants should contact the school office to obtain a CSEF application form or download from the website below

If you applied for CSEF at your child's school last year, you do not need to complete an application form this year unless there has been a change in your family circumstances.

You only need to complete an application form if any of the following changes have occurred:

- new student enrolments; your child has started or changed schools this year.
- changed family circumstances; such as a change of custody, change of name, concession card number, or new siblings commencing this year.

Check with the school office if you are unsure.
