It's very nice to play with.



Dragon Boat Festival By Nicole (LOTE Captain 2022)

Where does the dragon boat festival come from?

The Dragon Boat festival is celebrated in China in memory of Qu Yuan, who was one of the most famous poets in China in the third century. Qu Yuan was best known for his patriotism and eventually became a national hero. People were inspired by him, therefore started dragon boat racing and making Zongzi (sticky rice dumplings) in commemoration of him.



How do we celebrate it?

The Dragon Boat festival was on Friday, June 3, 2022 but is always on the 5th day of the 5th month in the lunar calendar each year. During the Dragon Boat festival, Chinese people do dragon boat racing and eat Zongzi, which can be made in different flavours.

Some people also hang special fresh herbs on their doors to purify the air and keep mosquitoes away.



How do I celebrate it?

During the Dragon Boat festival, my family and I make Zongzi with different fillings and wrapped with bamboo leaves. On the day after a big family dinner, we normally watch dragon boat racing on TV together.

Come and join in the fun of learning to play keyboard, guitar, here at Glendal Primary School.


Creative Music for Schools conducts a music program here at school each week.


